

THE 67th MEDICAL DEPOT

The 67th Medical Depot was organized on 23 March 1944 in the Army of the United States as the 67th Medical Depot Company, and was activated on 1 May 1944 at Noumea, New Caledonia. In February 1946, the unit was deactivated at South Beach, Manila, Philippine Islands. It was redesignated the 67th Army Medical Depot and allocated to the Regular Army on 28 August 1951, and activated 20 October 1951 at Fuerth Medical Depot at Fuerth, Germany, and later at Rhine Medical Depot, Einsiedlerhof, Germany.

On 1 April 1957, the 67th Medical Depot was assigned to the Seventh United States Army and attached to US Army Medical Depot Einsiedlerhof, for operation, administration and logistical support.

On 31 March 1967, USAREUR General Orders Number 103 removed the 67th Medical Depot from the 7th Army and assigned it to US Army Communications Zone, Europe. On 1 June 1967, USACOMZEUR General Orders Number 101, relieved the 67th from USACOMZEUR and assigned it to US Army Medical Depot, Einsiedlerhof. General Order 534, Headquarters, USAREUR & Seventh Army, dated 26 September 1968, assigned the 67th Medical Depot to the US Army Medical Command, Europe (Prov).

General Orders Number 23, Headquarters, US Army Medical Command, Europe (Prov), dated 13 October 1968 reassigned the 67th Medical Depot to the US Army Medical Materiel Center, Europe. The 67th contingency plans for supporting 7th Army still remain in effect and members of the 67th annually participate in 7th Army exercises. The 67th Medical Depot constitutes the basic military force for the operation of USAMMCE.
