# Camp Darby

The Camp Darby complex is composed of the main camp and the 25th Station Hospital at Tirrenia, the Port of Embarkation at Livorno and the Leghorn General Depot between Livorno and Pisa.

The main camp, which houses the headquarters and support functions for all military and dependent personnel, is named after a World War II hero, Brig Gen William O. Darby, leader of the famed Darby Rangers. Darby, who received the Silver Star and the Legion of Merit for his outstanding work in training and leading the 1st Ranger Battalion in North Africa, Sicily, and Italy, was killed in Italy by an exploding shell on April 30, 1945.

The Port of Embarkation was originally set up by Benito Mussolini to support his campaign in Ethiopia. In 1951 the Italian government granted the use of the port to the United States free of charge, an agreement which is still in existence.

The Port is equipped with a one million dollar floating crane and a 1,200 foot concrete pier capable of handling two ships simultaneously. Approximately 30 ships per month are processed by personnel at the installation.

The Livorno General Depot, which includes 13 warehouses and a large open storage area, receives, processes, stores and ships more than 90,000 items to "customers" throughout Europe and the Mediterranean area. A sophisticated, highly sensitive Automatic Data Processing Office greatly speeds operations at the Depot, which was the first—and for a long time the only—functionally integrated general depot in the Army.

The 25th Station Hospital, in existence since the founding of Camp Darby in 1951, provides in and out patient and surgical care for military personnel and dependents in the Livorno area.


